6. Tinnie Trip to the Warburton 2025

Date: Sun 10 - Sun 24th August 2025

Location: Kalamurina Station SA 5734

Leaders: Michael Polacek / Peter

Young

Convoy: min of 3 tinnies plus Support

crew. (4 booked)

Comment: Warburton Creek forms downstream from the confluence of the Diamantina and Georgina rivers in Goyder Lagoon, and flows in a southwesterly direction for about 150 km before discharging into Lake Eyre. Starting at Stoney Crossing on Kalamurina Station, we launch the Tinnies & travel 60km to Wetlands camp to refuel before continuing to the Warburton Groove (140km) then retrace our track (about 400km round

trip). Each participant must be completly self resourced, Tinnie (11-12 foot). 15 hp motor ability to take 220 litres of fuel, camping equipment, radios, food & water for at least 7 days on water. Zodiac to be towed on water with fuel for part of the journey. Starting with a 2 day drive from Adelaide. Support vehicles, towing fuel trailers will be needed as well to act as backup for the Tinnie troupe.

7. Kudriemitchie Outstation Trip & Working Bee

(subject to flood conditions)

Date: August 25 to 31, 2025

Terrain: Gravel roads with rocks shale & bulldust. Long distances, 1150 km. Suitable for caravan, Off Road Van, Camper Trailer, Tents

Comment: Situated about 1140 km north from Adelaide, and 85 km northwest of Innamincka on the Coongie Lakes Track (Montepirie Track) is Kudriemitchie Outstation, once a pastoral outstation used to accommodate the mustering parties away from the main homestead at Innamincka. TLCCSA members have been involved since 1995, renovating & restoring the Outstation mostly under the influence and enthusiasm of the late Steve Golley, DEW and Innamincka Station (Santos). This site is now heritage listed.

In August 2025 Innamincka will be the NPWS Park of the Month. NPWS will be shining a spotlight on Innamincka and no doubt travellers will visit Kudriemitchie. This trip is part tidying up and presentation and part relaxation (trying to catch elusive Yellow Belly fish). There is likely to be an earlier trip at short notice to assist and plan the tasks.

Rating: Scenic and moderate

Comment: Your opportunity to visit the world's largest sand island. The main way around the island is via the beach, which is generally easy to drive on, with a 80kph speed limit. The inland tracks can be rough due to the volume of traffic. More remote tracks have the potential to be softer and rutted out, again simply due to traffic and not being maintained.

Start at Rainbow Beach at 5:00pm on August 30, staying overnight at Rainbow Beach Caravan Park, 308 Carlo Road, Rainbow Beach Old 4581 before taking the ferry at Inskip Point to K'Gari on the 31st. Bush camping with facilities except for 1 night. Be aware of the dingos. Contact trip leader for detailed itinerary and more information. No caravans or trailers.

Essential gear- Long handle shovel, basic recovery gear, compressor, tyre deflater. Desirable - traction boards. Permits are required for vehicles driving on K'gari as well as separate camping permits at designated sites and dates. There is a ferry charge of \$140 return. Contact the trip leader for more details.

Also remember that Rainbow Beach is approximately 2200 Km from Adelaide, allow 2-3 days each way for this journey.

Here's a lesson I learnt last year. My 120 Prado kept throwing a P0400 error code so I trundled along to my mechanic, whom I trust, to get it checked out. First diagnoses was a dirty EGR valve and inlet manifold. Many hundreds of \$ later, the vehicle was returned to me supposedly fixed. Yes you've guessed it, the code reappeared. Back to my mechanic, whom I trust, for a review. Recommendation was to replace the EGR valve. Many hundreds of \$ latter the vehicle was returned to me supposedly fixed.

Feeling confident, off I went only to be disappointed again. I realized my mechanic, who was excellent servicing vehicles, didn't have the specialist knowledge to correctly diagnose the problem. Next instalment was the need to replace injectors so armed with some expensive experience I decided to pick a specialist diesel service provider to do the job, Hi Tech Diesel Injection. Joy of joys they advised me the infamous P0400 had reappeared after a test run of the vehicle. Diagnoses, which cost a proportion of their hourly rate, recommended an EGR Cooler replacement; which sorted out P0400 for good.

Moral of the story; if you a have vehicle problem, ask your mechanic, "can they give a correct diagnoses" and if you have any doubt go to a specialist.

Blinman Roadside Services Precinct

The Blinman Progress Association (BPA) is very proud to announce that its Blinman Roadside Services precinct is open for use.


Who will Manufacture Your Next Car?

Interesting times ahead. The Australian car market and indeed the global car market is about to go through massive change, the biggest in its history. Well established brands are struggling to survive like GM, VW, Nissan, Jeep, Mitsubishi and many more. Many of these brands will disappear within 5 years. Add to that global tariff wars, and the rise of chinese cars.

Locally we are in for a wild ride and massive disruption. Given the labour governments New Vehicle Efficiency Standards (NVES) are taking effect from July, traditional diesel new 4WD vehicles will become progressively more expensive. Landcruisers within 5 years will increase by \$10 - \$15K with NVES tax let alone Toyota CPI increases. Expect to pay \$15 - \$20k more within 5 years. At the same time we will see viable alternate chinese cars flood our market as they will offer a significantly cheaper offering packed with more technology and more value. The plug in hybrid and electric offerings will also improve. Batteries will become more user friendly with fast charging (10-15 mins) and longer range (1000-1500km). I predict many car brands in Australia will go broke or exit. Nissan, Isuzu, Mitsubishi, Jeep are all likely to disappear to be replaced by chinese offerings. Interesting to see how Toyota will deal with this.

The 70s had the arrival of Japanese jap crap cars, the 80s the cheap and nasty Korean cars the 90s & 00s the terrible Indian cars and now the Chinese. History demonstrates if you bring a reliable offering that meets people's needs at the right price it will sell. Japanese and Korean cars dominate our market and I suspect chinese cars will become a major player within 5 years. Just look at the uptake of the recent plug in hybrid BYD Shark Ute as an example. Government incentives a compelling price, a car loaded with technology and

a different offering saw that car go from unheard of in our market a few months ago to the number 7 highest selling car in Australia within months. The BYD is not without some issues but it is the first of many more to come that will only get better. Chinese car reliability and resale are likely to be poor initially but like any new entrants will improve over time. I suspect over time, many of us will be taking a serious look at some of the chinese wagons and utes on offer and deciding if we go with the cheaper more value packed options once reliability and resale improve.





and family. I also currently own 2 Toyota's, a Landcruiser 200 and a GR86 weapon of a sports car. I have recently bought a Prado and a seriously cool FJ Cruiser for my daughters. But Toyota you are on notice. You won't any longer be able to arrogantly offer a new 70 series with 1980s technology and mismatched front and rear wheel track and charge \$80K. Nor offer a VX 300 series in 2025 with no wireless Apple car play, no leather seats and no electric tailgate and charge \$130K. Competition is about to seriously hot up and Toyota you had better lift your game or customers will vote with their wallets. I wouldn't buy a chinese car at the moment given unproven reliability and poor resale. Fix these two issues with 3 years of experience and I would seriously consider one. Interested in your thoughts.






