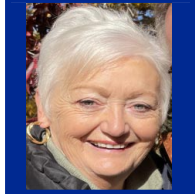

Border Track for the Young Ones (and young at heart!) Part 2



Back on the track the driving became more challenging, and fun! Some of the steep hills still had matting visible at the start of them to assist with the initial climb, but a lot of momentum was needed to reach the top. There were quite a few dips on the ascents, and we all experienced some bumpy rides! On some of the hills there were alternatives tracks that could be taken, but most of us stayed on the main ones to experience and enjoy the challenge!

We took a lunch break at approximately the 36km mark after a particularly challenging hill that caused Derek a few problems with his vehicle. Lunch gave the vehicle an opportunity to reset, and all was good when we re-commenced. As the afternoon progressed the melodic sound of bush pinstriping could be heard.

By midafternoon we could see two large gum trees ahead which Darryl informed us indicated the left turn to Red Bluff campground. We were now in Victoria, which caused us some confusion with time zones on our electronic devices. Some stayed with SA time, but some changed to Victorian time.

The Red Bluff campground, about 66km from our day's start at Pine Hut Soak, was very large and had several secluded camp areas. We drove past the initial camp area to a lovely spot a little higher up. Again, we had the entire campground to ourselves. A "reccie" to the toilets by the girls was not so positive, but Darryl saved the day with this gloves and long stick!



Derek took all the kids on a short hike to the peak of Red Bluff and the rest of us finished setting up camp. On their return the kids had fun collecting firewood and playing with the walkie talkies, while the adults enjoyed a relaxed chat and happy hour. The evening saw very clear skies, and we all enjoyed watching the vapor trails of far away jets, orbiting satellites and a sky full of brilliant stars. Later in the evening we were visited by what we thought looked initially like a fox, but we soon realized it was a large wild cat that took a couple of passes through our campsite.

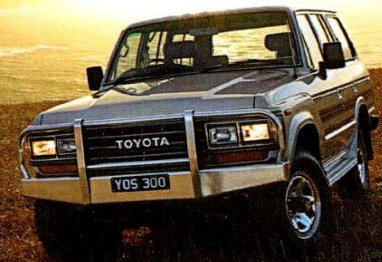

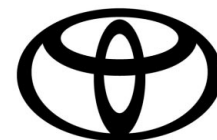

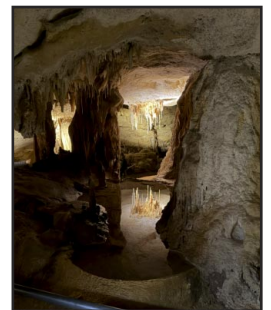
Wednesday 20th May

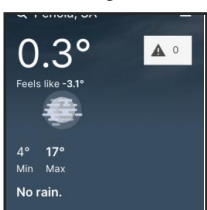

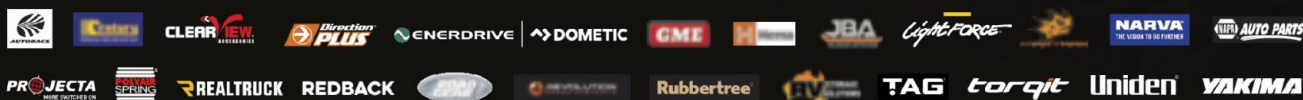

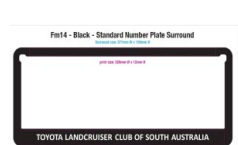
